Policy Check-Up Time for Wheat 2022

As you begin to plan for the season ahead, it is always a good idea to review your crop insurance policy. Whether you are looking to save on premium or increase coverage, we are here to provide the details of the Crop Insurance products you need.

If you need to make any changes to your wheat policy or purchase wheat insurance for the 2022 crop year it must be done no later than Sept. 30, 2021.

Note: Wheat must be planted by October 20th for full insurance coverage.

Wheat is uninsurable after the late plant date of October 25th.

Submitting a Notice of Loss

It is the insureds responsibility to report any suspected loss in a timely manner!

We will submit the Notice of Loss to the insurance company. If a loss is not reported or discovered until production is reported to us, it may be too late and the claim will be denied.

Turn your claims in early so that an adjuster can be assigned and ready when you are done harvesting!

Planted Crop - When there is damage or loss of production you must give our agency notice within 72 hours of discovery of damage or loss of production, but no later than 15 days after the end of the insurance period (most often, the harvest of the crop).

Crops with Revenue Protection - If there is no damage or loss of production, you must notify us no later than 45 days after the latest date the harvest price is released, for any crop where there is a suspected revenue loss.

Chopping Corn for Silage Rules

Corn Silage Appraisals Required!

If you have not yet done so, call 1-888-417-8623 to turn in your notice before silage harvest starts.

- ⇒ If you will be chopping any corn for silage please call us to request a silage appraisal. A two-week notice is helpful.
- ⇒ All corn that is chopped for silage needs to be appraised by a company adjuster for a dry bushel yield.
- ⇒ The dry bushel yield will be used in your actual production history (APH) for any field that is chopped.
- ⇒ The same goes for any corn that will be shelled above 30% moisture or any soybeans that will be harvested or destroyed for any reason before mature dry harvest.





CROP INSURANCE PREMIUMS

Premium due date is September 30, 2021 for all Spring planted crops.

Payment should be mailed to the insurance company, in advance, so that it is received by the due date. Any premiums made or received after the due date of September 30th are subject to interest.*

*DROUGHT RELIEF - NEW INTEREST DEFERAL

RMA recognizes the hardship insureds face due to nationwide drought conditions causing catastrophic crop damage. These conditions create a challenge for insureds to pay crop insurance premiums timely and to avoid interest accrual, RMA authorized AIP's to provide additional time for insureds to:

- Pay premium and administrative fees on policies with a premium billing date between August 1, 2021 and September 30, 2021.
- RMA waived interest accrual on premium payments and administrative fees until the earliest of 60 days past the scheduled payment due date for the termination date for these policies.
- Interest begins to accrue again after this additional time period on unpaid premium and administrative fees.

AIPs are authorized to provide additional time for policyholders to make payment of premium and administrative fees. Interest accrual on premium payments and administrative fees, as noted above, will be waived to the earliest of an additional 60 days of the scheduled payment due date or the termination date on policies with premium billing dates between August 1, 2021 and September 30, 2021. AIPs will begin to accrue interest after this additional period for unpaid premium and administrative fees.
